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

Be prepared to arrive at foreign destination

When **looking forward to** a foreign trip, **mostly** if you go overseas, you have to be well prepared. With a little effort you can be a **seasoned globetrotter**.

So, let's see what you'll need!

Of course, the most important thing is to have all the **required** documents. If you are an EU national, you don't need to show you national ID card or passport when you are travelling from one border-free Schengen EU country to another. But even if you don't need a passport for **border checks**, it is still highly **recommended** to take a passport or ID card with you, so you can **prove** your **identity** if needed when, for example, you are stopped by police, or **boarding a plane**. Always check to make sure that your passport has not expired. It is always **advisable** to have several photocopies of your passport, leaving one with a friend or relative and packing at least two in your luggage. Driving licences, post, bank or **tax cards** are not **accepted** as **valid** travel documents or **proof** of identity. Find out whether special visas or vaccinations are needed for entry to the country or countries you're planning to visit.





Be prepared to arrive at foreign destination

As soon as you arrive in a foreign country, chances are you'll need some money in the **local currency**. So, it is always a good idea to have some local currency **on hand** even before you leave home. The golden rule is never to keep all your money in one place. If you **get robbed** or **misplace** your stuff, you lose everything. Carry a useful amount of cash for a day hidden somewhere discreet, and leave the rest in a secure spot, like your hotel safe, even if you plan to **primarily** use a bankcard while abroad. Many people prefer to use cards while they're away. Before leaving, always make sure your card is accepted in the country you plan to visit. Never let your card out of your sight! Most credit card **scams** require time alone with your card!

Last, but not least, always be prepared for little details, as well. For example, electrical sockets are not created equal. So, if you are going to use electrical appliances, such as notebooks or cell phones, you need to know what type of voltage is used in the country you're travelling to and what type of adapter or plug is needed to plug your appliances into the outlet. If necessary, bring a voltage adapter and special plugs with you.




